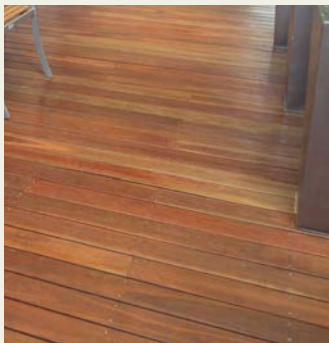

Spotted Gum Decking

Spotted Gum is a rich individual timber and very popular for decking application, desired by Customers, Specifiers, Architects and Designers the world over, particularly for its striking backsawn grain structure, attractive fiddleback and vibrant colour palette. The word “spotted” refers to large spot like features that form on the tree as it sheds its bark in strips.



The life of a beautiful Spotted Gum deck is greater than 40 years in an external environment due to it being a high durable native timber. This species has a natural resistance to termites and is absorbent to paint, stain and polish. Making Spotted Gum a popular choice as an outdoor decking timber.

With its PEFC certification, Spotted Gum meets some of the strictest environment criteria in the world and is only harvested from sustainably managed forests.

We produce Spotted Gum into sawn boards which are then kiln dried to the rigorous Hurford standard before production and quality assurance phase.

Colour	Heartwood pale to dark brown to dark chocolate with some reddish tinges. Sapwood is distinctively paler.
Grade	Standard & Better – Is generally of a clearer appearance as gum veins are rarely present. It has a fine, even texture and usually features an interlocked grain with some surface checking.
